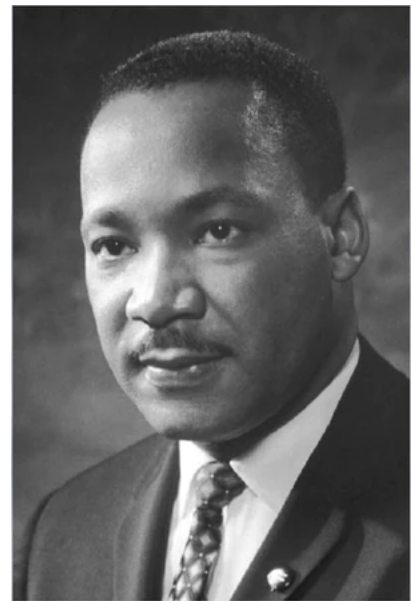
Greetings friend!

We Celebrate Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day!

On January 15, 1929, an American Baptist minister and one of the most prominent leaders in the civil rights movement in America, was born. Inspired by his Christian beliefs, he advanced civil rights for people of color through nonviolence and civil disobedience. He led targeted, nonviolent resistance against Jim Crow laws and other forms of discrimination.

King oversaw the 1955 Montgomery bus boycott and later became the first president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC). As president of the SCLC, he led the Albany Movement in Albany, Georgia and helped organize some of the nonviolent 1963 protests in Birmingham, Alabama.

Dr. King was one of the leaders of the 1963 March on Washington where he delivered his “[I have a Dream](#)” speech on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial. The civil rights movement achieved pivotal legislation in the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Voting Rights Act of 1965, and the Fair Housing Act of 1968.



Dr. King cast the vision for race relations in America. His vision was that America would become a **colorblind** society. His vision led to affirmative action programs credited with leveling the playing field. King was a staunch believer in equal opportunity, not equal outcome.

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was assassinated in Memphis on April 4, 1968. President Ronald Reagan signed legislation establishing Martin Luther King, Jr. Day in 1986.

His vision is under grave attack today.

Dr. King's vision was to unify America. This vision gained momentum in colleges and universities throughout the land. His vision filtered down into high school and elementary schools. For the last 40 years of the 20th century, America moved toward the colorblind society that Dr. King envisioned.

The Present Day...

Teaching from our institutions of higher learning has reversed course. Colleges and universities teach that everything should be viewed through the lens of race. Teachers coming from these institutions are teaching this view of race...the effect is separating us, not unifying us...to children in elementary and high schools.

We are being taught that, based on the color or your skin, you are either oppressed or are an oppressor! Academia has promulgated this patently racist teaching as Critical Race Theory (CRT), Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI), or some portions of Social Emotional Learning (SEL).

Dorms, graduation ceremonies, and other student activities on many college and university campuses are segregated...including in our valley!

How did this happen? More importantly, what can we do about it?

We can stand up! We can stand for American values and common sense! We can say enough is enough! We can peacefully and respectfully inform our board members that this will not stand!
